## Big Ideas

- ✓ Societies meet the needs of individuals and groups in different ways.
- ✓ Being a Canadian influences both individual identity and our identity as a part of a group.
- ✓ Quality of life is influenced by the decisions made by the government and the strength of the economy.

#### **Essential Questions**

- How do societies meet the needs of individuals and groups?
- How does being a Canadian influence my individual and collective identity?
- How is my quality of life influenced by my government and the economy?

#### **Course Overview**

How do our government and economy work? How do they affect me? Grade 9 Social Studies focuses on citizenship, identity, and quality of life. You will examine the relationships between Canada's political and legislative processes, and the impact of these processes on governance, rights, citizenship, and identity. You will also explore issues of economics and its impact on quality of life, citizenship and identity in Canada and the United States.

You will discover the important influences that **government** and **economics** have on our lives. You'll focus on the **rights**, **roles**, and **responsibilities** of citizens in decision-making processes and in the Canadian **justice system**. You will also explore issues related to **immigration** and consider the impact of economic decisions on the quality of life experienced in Canada and in the United States.

### **Student Expectations**
