# Cosmetology 20/30

Cosmetology Studies focuses on personal and professional grooming, body care, and enhancement practices, and provides students opportunities to explore and prepare for cosmetology-related career options.

This course will introduce the students to basic manicuring and pedicuring practices. Students will also learn the practice of gel nail enhancement and basic nail art application. They will learn about safety and procedural practices with these cosmetology services, and gain an understanding of how to offer these services in a salon and personal business setting.

# Marking Scheme:

The marking scheme for cosmetology will focus on both theoretical and practical components. Students will need to successfully complete all components of a module before moving on to another module.

The following modules will be offered this semester for Cosmetology 20/30 students:

## **EST1020: SKIN CARE PRACTICES**

Prerequisite: COS1010: Personal & Professional Practices I credit

Students identify the basic structures and functions of the skin.
 Students analyze skin and perform basic skin care practices, including cleansing, toning, nourishing and protecting.

### **EST 1070: MANICURING 1**

Prerequisite: COS1010: Personal & Professional Practices I credit

 Students identify the functions, shapes and basic structure of fingernails, identify conditions of the hands and fingernails, and perform basic manicures.

# **EST3090: NAIL ENHANCEMENT - GEL**

Prerequisite: EST1070: Manicuring 1

• Students describe and demonstrate techniques used to apply gel nails and describe the effects of gel nails on natural nails.

Each cosmetology module will involve a written component (module booklets, assignments, etc.), labs, and assessments. The following general timeline will be followed as closely as possible to achieve course goals.
