## COURSE CONTENT:

The intent of the English program is to enable each student to understand and appreciate language and to use it confidently and competently for a variety of purposes, with a variety of audiences and in a variety of situations for communication, personal satisfaction and learning.

#### This course should assist students in their growth of

- a. knowledge of language
- b. development of proper usage
- c. appreciation of the value of language and literature
- d. the awareness of the relationship of language to other forms of artistic expression
- e. critical awareness and analysis, and reflection

The English Language Arts program highlights six language arts: listening, speaking, reading, writing, viewing and representing. These six components will be measured throughout the course by use of various texts such as:

-Novel -Feature Film -Modern and/or Shakespearean Play -Poetry -Short Stories -Visual and Multimedia Texts -Essay -Popular Nonfiction (articles, interviews, etc)

### **EXPECTATIONS:**

- Students must arrive on time with required materials: pen, pencil, paper, texts.
  - Those arriving late must submit a note from the office before entering class. Do not forget to go to the office to receive a late slip. You will not be permitted to enter class without one.
- Students will participate in a positive and constructive manner. Use language that is school-appropriate. Raise your hand and wait to be acknowledged before speaking.

- Students will complete and submit work on time. Coming in at lunch or after school to complete late work is something that can be pre-arranged. This helps to ensure that I can to return work and update grades in a timely manner, which I am unable to do until everyone has submitted their work.
- Students will quickly make up work missed due to an absence. Check the Google Classroom or with me for any missing assignments. If you are not clear about what to do, see me after class OR email me.
- Students will not skip assignments or "take a zero" on any assignment. Parents/guardians and administration will be notified should this occur.
- Students will ask permission to leave class (one person at a time), except in the case of a serious emergency. Do not abuse the privilege by asking to leave the room frequently or remaining out of the room any longer than necessary. The bell DOES NOT dismiss class.
