### **Teaching Methodology**

# **Sewing Supplies List For PJ Pants**

flannelette fabric – amount will depend on the length they wish to make their pants as well as the width of their fabric. 2.50 meters is usually enough for most students however they may require less if their fabric is wide or they may require more if they want a long leg length. Please have your child wash and dry their fabric before bringing it to school.
$\square$ 2.5 cm wide elastic to fit their waist measurement + 3 cm.
☐ 1 spool of thread to match their fabric.
☐ 2 large safety pins
seam ripper
☐ measuring tape
□ pins
☐ pin cushion or pin magnet
☐ 1 package of sewing machine needles for woven fabric.
