Course Overview:

Forensic science 25 applies basic scientific knowledge to the investigation of crimes. This is a three credits course which focuses on some techniques and practices used by forensic scientists during Crime Scene Investigation (CSI). Students explore and understand further how various elements of the crime scenes are analysed and processed.

<u>Disclaimer:</u>

A central component of this course involves the analysis of realistic scenarios and case study. The course might have some controversial and sensitive components which may include, among others:

- ✓ Blood photographs and simulated blood experiments
- \checkmark Discussion of semen analysis and the use of rape kits
- \checkmark Examination of alcohol and substance abuse and use

Suggested timeline:

Forensic 25 has five modules. We will spend approximately 7 classes on each module.

Module 4: Forensic Detection of Impaired Driving

Topics:

- \checkmark Alcohol and its effects upon human body
- ✓ The breathalyzer
- ✓ The intoxilyzer and consequences of impaired driving
- \checkmark Case study

Module 5: Polygraphing and Document Analysis

Topics:

- ✓ Stress indicator and the polygraph instrument
- \checkmark The polygraph examination
- ✓ Forensic writing analysis
- ✓ Case study
